

## Student Checklist

### Language, Literature, and Culture of Ancient Greece

This minor is designed to provide a basic, but contextual and broad, familiarity with Greek language and literature and the civilization of ancient Greece. More specifically, it requires students to study, at the intermediate and advanced level, Greek and authors writing poetry and/or prose, but at the same time it acquaints the student with the broader historical, social, and cultural context in which these authors lived and worked.

#### Prerequisites:

- Greek 301 or equivalent, as determined by the departmental placement examination.

At least **16 credits** of courses chosen from the following three groups:
