## CONDENSED RULES FOR RECORDING FOOTBALL STATISTICS\*

(Issued by the N.C.A.A. Football Rules Committee's Sub-committee on Football Statistics)

(Continued from back of Form 347-A)

### SECTION 6—PUNTS.

**Article 1:** Punts are measured from the line of scrimmage to the point of ultimate advance, if the ball remains in the field of play or goes out of bounds. (Note—"Ultimate advance" is the point where ball goes out of bounds, is downed, or is recovered by the defense to attempt a runback.)

(Note—"Ultimate advance" of the punt shall be construed to include also any distance which a receiver of the punt may retreat toward his own goal before attempting to return up field. This interpretation gives greatest benefit to both the punter and the receiver, since excellence of the punt normally is responsible for retreat by the receiver. Thus "minus yards" should NOT be recorded under "punt returns".)

**Article 2:** When a punt goes over the goal line (a touchback), distance of the punt is measured from the line of scrimmage to the 20-yard line only, since this is the limit of the punt's value to the kicking team.

**Article 3:** If a receiver muffs a punt and the ball continues toward his goal line, the punt is measured to the point of recovery or ultimate advance, as defined above. If a receiver muffs a punt and the ball bounds back toward the kicker's goal, the punt is measured to the point of the muff (the point of ultimate advance), and the receiver is credited with a punt return and with the yards from the point of the muff to the point of recovery, regardless of which team recovers the fumble.

**Article 4:** Punts blocked are included in "times kicked", and the yardage of a partially blocked kick is included in "yards kicked". If the ball travels toward the kicker's goal, and is recovered by the blocking (defending) team, the yardage is treated as a punt return by the player who blocked the kick. If the ball travels toward the kicker's goal and is recovered by the kicking team, the yardage is treated as a kick return by the player who blocked the kick, but the blocking team is charged with a fumble lost.

### SECTION 7—KICK RETURNS.

**Article 1:** Only the number of punts and kickoffs which the receiving team actually attempts to return are included under kick returns. (Exception—Blocked kicks which travel toward the kicker's goal. See Article 4 of Section 6.)

**Article 2:** The return will be measured from the point where the returning player actually gains control of the ball to the point where the ball is declared dead, or is lost by fumble. There are no "minus yards" under kick returns (see note under Article 1 of Section 6).

**Article 3:** The return of an attempted field goal, which falls short and is returned by the defending team, is treated as a punt return.

### SECTION 8—FREE KICKS.

Free kicks are recorded as kickoffs if made from placement, and as punts if the ball is punted. The receiving player is credited with a kickoff return, or a punt return, respectively.

### SECTION 9—GOALS FROM THE FIELD.

Successful goals from the field are measured from the scrimmage line to the goal line, plus ten yards, since the goal posts are ten yards behind the goal line. The distance of such kicks is recorded only under "principal individual plays" on the reverse side of the Summary. The distance of a field goal attempt is not recorded under "punting".

### SECTION 10—POINTS AFTER TOUCHDOWNS.

**Article 1:** A player attempting a try-for-point-after-touchdown by kicking is not charged with an attempt when a bad pass from center, or a fumble by the ball holder, precludes an opportunity to kick. Such an unsuccessful attempt is charged to the "team", rather than to any individual player. However, if the ball is momentarily fumbled and then kicked, an attempt is charged to the individual kicker, regardless of the success or failure of the effort.

**Article 2:** When a try-for-point-after-touchdown by forward passing is successful, the receiver is both charged with the attempt and credited with the point scored. When such a try is unsuccessful, the passer is charged with the attempt.

### SECTION 11—SAFETIES.

No individual credit is recorded for any player on either team when a safety is scored. The team benefitting from the score is credited.

### SECTION 12—FUMBLES.

On any play terminated by a fumble, the yards involved to the point of recovery are credited or charged to the player who fumbled, regardless of which team recovers the fumble.

(Approved Ruling—On rushing play, ball carrier of Team A fumbles at the line of scrimmage and the ball travels 5 yards toward Team B goal line, before it is recovered by Team B. Player of Team A who fumbled is credited with rushing gain of 5 yards, and Team A is charged with a fumble lost.)

### WILD PASS FROM CENTER.

Any loss resulting from an obvious wild pass from center is charged to "center pass", and not to any individual player.

**CONDENSED RULES FOR RECORDING FOOTBALL STATISTICS\***

(Issued by the N.C.A.A. Football Rules Committee's Sub-committee on Football Statistics)

**SECTION 1—FIRST DOWNS.**

A first down shall be recorded whenever the yardsticks are ordered forward by the officials, and when a touchdown is scored from scrimmage (by rushing or passing) within a series of downs starting 10 yards or more from the goal line. A first down is **not** recorded on a touchdown runback, regardless of the distance of the scoring run.

The passer is **not** charged with a pass attempt, nor credited with a pass completed or yards gained; nor is the intended receiver (or the player interfered with) credited with a pass caught. The passing team is credited only with a first down by penalty. The defensive (offending) team is charged with a penalty, and the distance from the line of scrimmage to the spot of the penalty, under "yards penalized."

**Article 6:** The forward passer is charged with a forward pass attempt when a forward pass is ruled intentionally grounded.

**SECTION 2—RUSHING.**

**Article 1:** All offensive running plays are to be classified as rushing plays, **not** as "plays from scrimmage," since any play begun with a snapback from center actually is a play from scrimmage.

**Article 2:** Rushing yardage is measured from the line of scrimmage to the point where the ball is declared dead, or is recovered by opponents in the case of a fumble.

**Article 3:** The rushing total is a **net** figure. All rushing losses must be recorded so as to account for the net figure.

**Article 4:** All gains on lateral passes which originated or grew out of a rushing play are included in rushing yardage. (See Article 1 of Section 4.)

**SECTION 4—LATERAL PASSING.**

**Article 1:** A lateral pass is always a component part of the ultimate play, whether it precedes or follows that play, since the lateral is merely an extension of the original or ultimate play, in effect.

(Approved Ruling—Player A receives a forward pass for a gain of 10 yards, then throws a lateral pass to Player B, who gains an additional 5 yards. Player A is credited with one pass caught and 10 yards under "receiving". Player B is credited with **NO** pass caught and with 5 yards under "receiving". Player who threw the forward pass is credited with 15 yards under "forward passing".)

(Approved Ruling—Player A catches punt and returns 10 yards before throwing a lateral pass to Player B, who returns another 5 yards. Player A is credited with one return and 10 yards under "punt returns". Player B is credited with **NO** return and with 5 yards under "punt returns".)

**SECTION 3—FORWARD PASSING.**

**Article 1:** Forward passing gains or losses are measured from the scrimmage line to the point where the ball is declared dead (or is recovered by opponents in the case of a fumble), so as to include both length of pass and running advance after completion. All yards gained or lost on each completed pass play are credited to **both** the passer and the receiver.

**Article 2:** Loss from a completed forward pass which did not advance the ball to the scrimmage line is a yardage charge against passing gain.

**Article 3:** Any loss by a player apparently intending to pass, but thrown behind the line of scrimmage, is recorded as a **loss by rushing**. He is **not** a passer until he has thrown the ball, and he retains at all times the option of running.

**Article 4:** Interception returns are measured from the point of interception to the point where the ball is declared dead (or is recovered by opponents in the case of a fumble).

**Article 5:** There is **no** pass completed by penalty. A gain through interference on a passing play is a penalty against the defending team.

**Article 2:** Incomplete lateral passes are scored as fumbles, and yards lost are charged against the player who, in the scorer's opinion, was responsible for the failure of the pass.

**Article 3:** Intercepted lateral passes are scored as fumbles, the offensive team being charged with a fumble lost.

**Article 4:** The official scorer rules on whether a completed pass to a flanker or man-in-motion is a forward or a lateral pass. If the latter, the play is recorded under "rushing". If the pass is incomplete, the subsequent action of the officials reveals whether the pass was a forward or a lateral.

**SECTION 5—TOTAL OFFENSE.**

**Article 1:** Total offense is the combined result of rushing and forward passing **only**, since these two are the only methods by which legal advance can be initiated while retaining possession of the ball.

**Article 2:** Total offense yardage is the total of **net** gain by rushing and net gain by forward passing. "Receiving" yards gained are **not** included in total offense.

Illinois vs. Michigan, Memorial stadium, Nov. 5, 1955.

Temp. 58, wind 20-25 mph out of south.

### First quarter

Michigan won the toss and elected to defend the south goal. Illinois elected to receive.

Branoff kicked and Bates downed the ball in the end zone, Illinois first and ten on the Illinois 20.

Jefferson 3 at c. Nitschke 2 at lt. Bates ~~xxxxxxx~~ fumbled out of bounds for a 4 yard loss. Nitschke punted against the wind, dead on the Michigan 48.

Barr 3 outside rt. Branoff 6 at rt. Branoff made first down at rt to the Illinois 42.

Barr at lt for 5 but Michigan offside and penalized to Illinois 47. Barr at rt for 6. Michigan time out. Jim Minor intercepted Branoff's pass on the Illinois 39.

Jefferson at rg for 3. Nitschke up middle for 3. Jefferson at re for 1st on the 50. Bates stopped at le. Lindbeck's pass to Des Enfants was incomplete. Jefferson over rg for first on the Michigan 32.

Lindbeck to Des Enfants ~~xxxx~~ to the 25. Lindbeck passed to Des Enfants for a touchdown with 8:20 gone in first quarter. Miller's attempted placement was blocked, by Hendricks.

Illinois 6, Michigan 0.

Miller kicked off south. Baldacci returned to the Michigan 35. Baldacci up middle for 5. Branoff at lg for 3. Baldacci at rg for first on the 48. Branoff's long pass to Kramer was incomplete. Branoff's pass to Hendricks, incomplete. On a pick, Hill up middle for 4. Maddock punted out of bounds on the Illinois 15 and Michigan penalized to the Michigan 37 for unnecessary roughness. Maddock punted again, over the end zone, and Illinois first and ten on the Illinois 20.

Jefferson at re for 4. Bates stopped at lex after 3 yards. Jefferson outside rt for 1st on the 31. Nitschke up middle for 5. Bates lost 3 at le. Lindbeck passed to Des Enfants to the Michigan 34, Michigan pushing and Illinois declined. Jefferson 1 at rg. this was last play of quarter.

Illinois 6, Michigan 0.

Second quarter

On a reverse Bates lost ten. On a draw play Nitschke up middle to Michigan 28. Lindbeck lateraled to Jefferson who rounded re to 25. Illinois clipping but Michigan refused and took ball.

Hendricks rounded re to the 29. Branoff rounded le for first on the 40. Balacacci 5 at rg. Hendricks stopped at re. Branoff, on a reverse, over lg for first on the Illinois 48.

Branoff's pass to VanPelt incomplete. Van Pelt's pass to Kramer broken up by Lindbeck. Balacacci on pick for 4. VanPelt punted to Jefferson who fumbled on Illinois 20 but Walsh recovered for Illinois.

Jefferson at re for 6. Jeffersun up middle for 1. Jefferson at rg missed a first down by inches on the 29. Woodson kicked to Hendricks who was downed by Hanson on the Michigan 12 but Michigan clipped, Illinois held, nullifying play. Woodson punted again, to Hendricks, who returned to the Michigan 26.

Branoff outside lt to 33. Balacacci fumbled and was tackled by Oliver for a 3 yard loss Branoff at lg for 3. Maddock's punt was partially blocked by Oliver and went dead on the Illinois 41.

Hendrick intercepted Lindbeck's pass on the 26 and returned to the Michigan 39. Branoff over lt for 1st on the 48. Hendricks at ~~rg~~ rg for 4. Maddock's passing. Maddock's pass to Kramer was too long. Maentz punted dead on the Illinois 19.

Nitschke fumbled and Balacacci recovered for Michigan on the Illinois 18. Branoffov lt for touchdown with 3:55 to go in the quarter. On a mixup there was no chance for a kick and an attempted pass was tied to an ineligible man.

Illinois 6, Michigan 6.

Michigan kicked south. Branoff kicked to Nitschke who received and was downed on the Illinois 30. Woodson at rt for 6. Lindbeck, trapped on pass, went up middle for 2. Jefferson made 1st up middle but Illinois was offside and penalized to 33. On a pick Nitschke at rg for 6. Woodson punted out of bounds on the Michigan 8.

Barr up middle for 5. Balacacci at rg for 4. Shannon at lg for 1st on the 19. Barr into line as clock ran out.

Illinois 6, Michigan 6.

### THIRD QUARTER

Michigan, Branoff, kicked off north, and the ball went out of the end zone. Illinois 1st and 10 on the Illinois 20. Jefferson up middle for 6. Jefferson stopped at rt. Nitschke up middle for 3. Nitschke punted to Barr who returned six yards to the Michigan 37.

Illinois offside before play started. Branoff off rg for ~~xxxxxx~~ Siegert threw Barr for a one yard loss. Barr outside rt for 1st on the 50. Shannon at rg for 4. Branoff up middle for 1. VanPelt's pass to Branoff incomplete. VanPelt punted over goal line and Illinois took over, 1st and 10, on the Illinois 20.

Woodson at le for 5. Jefferson at lg for 4. Woodson stopped at lg. Woodson punted to Barr who was downed on the Michigan 35 after a 4 yard return.

Barr's pass was knocked down by Nitschke. Maddock's pass knocked down by Nitschke. Maddock's pass to Hickey, incomplete. Maentz punted to Mitchell who returned 7 yards to the Illinois 28.

Mitchell over lg for 8. Illinois took too much time in huddle and penalized back to 30. Mitchell over rt and finally pushed out of bounds on the Michigan 16, a 54-yard run.

Mitchell trapped at re and lost 2. Lindbeck's pass into end zone was incomplete, Illinois was holding, and penalized back to 31. Mitchell on reverse to 24. Lindbeck's pass to Mitchell, inc. Miller replaces Siegert, for field goal try. It turned out to be a fake, Lindbeck getting ball, passing to Woodson who ran for a touchdown. 10:06 gone in period. Miller's placement was blocked.

ILLINOIS 12, MICHIGAN 6.

Illinois kicked south. Baldacci returned to the Michigan 37, 13 yard return. Branoff up middle for 1st on the Illinois 45. Baldacci over rg for 8. Branoff up middle for 1st on the 33. Branoff up middle for 2. Maddock passed to Kramer for first on the 16.
