> FINAL 1957 BIG TEN INDIVIDUAL STATISTICS (For Release to AM's, Friday, Nov. 29)

Chicago, Ill., Nov. -- Jim Pace, Michigan's power-packed sprinting halfback, reigns as the Big Ten's leading ground gainer and scorer for 1957. His 164 yards last week against Ohio State, second only to 170 yards recorded last week by Ray Nitschke of Illinois as the season's one-game high, was enough to put Pace ahead of Ohio's injured Don Clark, who finished second in rushing with 515 yards despite laying out of his final two games.

Pace also captured scoring honors, with 54 points and a one touchdown margin over Clark.

Bob White, Ohio's spectacular fullback, moved into third place in final rushing standings with 506 yards, a 5-yard margin over Wisconsin's Danny Lewis.

Jim Van Pelt, Michigan quarterback, took passing honors for the season, mainly on the strength of 7 touchdown throws and only two interceptions as compared with 11 charged to Iowa's Randy Duncan, who held a wide margin in passing yardage. Duncan's yardage total of 695, coupled with 52 yards running, was far and away enough to earn total offense honors.

Other individual leaders for the season were Iowa's Jim Gibbons in pass receiving, with 26 catches; Kenny Mikes of Purdue in punting with an average of 38.8 yards; Mike Hagler of Iowa, with an average kickoff return of 27.1 yards; and Minnesota's Dick Larson with an average punt return of 25.5 yards. Hagler, Danny Lewis, and Bob Soltis of Minnesota each intercepted three passes.

FINAL 1957 BIG TEN TEAM STATISTICS (For Release to PM's, Friday, Nov. 29)

Chicago, Ill., Nov. -- Michigan State was the Big Ten's leading team on offense and defense in 1957, according to official Conference statistics which also reveal the basis for Ohio State's undefeated Conference season and championship.

The Buckeyes, who were only 14 yards a game behind the Spartans in total and one point per game behind in scoring, stand out in the records for a minimum of offensive errors. They had only one pass intercepted all season and lost the ball on fumbles only 8 times.

They were able to put the ball in play more than ten times a game more than opponents. Iowa, with a high of 5.4 yards per play, was third on offense and second in team defense for the season.
