MICHIGAN vs. Ohio State POST-GAME NOTES

ATTENDANCE RECORD

Today's crowd of 106,867 established two Michigan and NCAA attendance records. The 106,867 crowd is the largest in Michigan and NCAA history, surpassing the old record of 106,851 set against Notre Dame earlier this year. Today's crowd lifted Michigan's total home attendance to 739,560 for seven games this year, a new Michigan and NCAA single season attendance record. The old single season attendance record was 731,281 set by Michigan in 1987. Michigan averaged 105,651 fans per game this year, the second highest season average attendance in Michigan and NCAA history behind Michigan's NCAA record average of 105,867 set in 1992.

INTERCEPTIONS

Michigan has recorded four plus interceptions in its last two games. Prior to that, the last time the Wolverines intercepted four passes in one game was in a 52-28 victory over Iowa in 1992. Ty Law has intercepted two passes in each of the last two games. The last Wolverine to intercept two passes in one game before Law was Todd Plate against Ohio State in 1989. Michigan's other interceptions were by Alfie Burch and Chuck Winters, the first interception of Winters' career.

SHUTOUTS

Today's 28-0 shutout win marks the first time the Wolverines have held the Buckeyes scoreless since a 22-0 victory in 1976. The last time Michigan shut out Ohio State in Ann Arbor was in a 19-0 win in 1956. The last time Ohio State was shutout was a 6-0 loss to Wisconsin in 1982. The last time Michigan shut out an opponent was a 20-0 win at Illinois in 1991, and Michigan's last home shutout was a 24-0 defeat of Wisconsin in 1989. The Wolverines have held their last three opponents scoreless in the first half.

WHEATLEY PASSES 1,000

Tyrone Wheatley's 105 yards on 16 carries against the Buckeyes give him 1,005 rushing yards on the season, marking the twentieth time that a Michigan player has rushed for over 1,000 yards in a season. Last season, Whetley rushed for 1,357 yards to become the 13th Wolverine to run for over 1,000 yards in a season. With his 1,005 yards this season and 1,357 yards in 1992, Wheatley joins Jamie Morris (1985, 1986, and 1987), Butch Woolfolk (1980 and 1981), Rob Lytle (1974 and 1975), Gordon Bell (1974 and 1975), and Ron Johnson (1967 and 1968) as the only Michigan players with two or more 1,000-yard rushing seasons. Wheatley's 105 rushing yards give him 14 games of 100 or more rushing yards in his career, and his sixth game of over 100 rushing yards this season. Michigan is 12-1-1 when Wheatley rushes for 100 yards or more in his career and Michigan is 5-1 this season when Wheatley rushes for 100 yards or more in a game. Wheatley now has 2,900 career rushing yards, 100 yards shy of becoming only the fifth Wolverine to amass 3,000 career rushing yards. Wheatley's 105 rushing rushing yards boosted his career all-purpose yardage total to 3,967, moving him past Desmond Howard (3,943 all-purpose yards in 1989-91) into fourth place on Michigan's career all-purpose yardage list.

OPPONENTS IN NO RUSH

The Michigan defense held Ohio State to only 58 rushing yards on 28 carries today (2.0 avg.) marking the third consecutive game and the fifth time this season that Michigan has held its opponent to less than 100 rushing yards in a game. In Michigan's last three games, the Wolverines have limited their opponents to total of 81 rushing yards on 72 carries (OSU-58 yards on 28 carries, Minnesota-15 yards on 19 carries, and Purdue-eight yards on 25 carries) for an average gain of only 1.1 yards per rush.

MILESTONES

Burch had two pass breakups to boost his season total 12 and move into second place on Michigan's single season pass break-up list. Marion Body holds the single season pass break-up record with 14 in 1982... Derrick Alexander caught three passes for 64 yards to move his career total to 1,977 receiving yards, the fourth most in Michigan history. Alexander needs 23 receiving yards to reach 2,000 career receiving yards and join Anthony Carter and Desmond Howard as the only Wolverines to amass 2,000 receiving yards and 3,000 all-purpose yards in a career.

> "I'm shocked on the magnitude of the final score. If you told me we'd lose 28-0. I'd have probably stayed home. We had a good year, but this dampers it quite a bit."

"Gary really had his team ready to play today. They have good players, I've been saying that all year. A game like this makes you wonder how they lost so many games. If they played like they did today all year, they could be the champions."

"Early in the game, they made some big plays. The Hayes catch was excellent. When we tried to get back into the game we threw 4 interceptions. They blitzed quite a bit and got us out of synch. We just couldn't get back into it. You have to give Michigan credit, they made big plays today."

"Obviously I am very happy with this team, it was a very big win. We played like Gary Moeller: we should have all season, with emotion... we got some injured back today but the key was the other guys who have now gained experience. We have set sail today... when we have this attitude we're a pretty good team. We had to find out who wanted to play and who wanted to play tough. I'm proud of this team."

> "I knew our team was ready to play, but face it you saw two great catches. The one by Mercury Hayes was unbelievable and Derrick Alexander made another great catch."

"We wanted our respect. We had a chance at Penn State and got it and we had another one today."

"It was probably our lack of success during the season that helped in our victory this time. Ohio State is a very good football team. They have done a good job. We beat a heck of a football team."
