Post-Game Notes Michigan vs. Memphis

Michigan tailback Tshimanga Biakabutuka rushed for a pair of touchdowns and a career-best 143 yards, and wide receiver Mercury Hayes caught five passes for 98 yards to lead Michigan to a 24-7 victory over the Memphis Tigers. The Wolverines held a 14-0 halftime advantage on the way to the victory and a 3-0 season start, Michigan's best since 1986.

BEST START SINCE '86

The win gave Michigan its best start to a season since 1986. In that year, the Wolverines started with nine straight wins before finishing with an 11-2 record and the Big Ten championship. Since then, 'M' has lost one of the first three games of every season, with the exception of 1992. The Wolverines opened the 1992 campaign with a 17-17 tie against Notre Dame, then won their next eight games before tying the final two regular-season contests and finishing with a 9-0-3 mark.

BET ON BIAKABUTUKA

When Tshimanga Biakabutuka rushes for at least 100 yards, the Wolverines are 6-0. His two first-half touchdown runs against Memphis gave the Wolverine tailback five touchdowns in less than three quarters of game action. After scoring three TD's on the first three Michigan drives of the second half against Illinois, Biakabutuka sat out the rest of the third period and all of the fourth against the Illini. The multi-TD game was the second consecutive for Biakabutuka and fourth of his career. He rushed for a pair of TD's in 1993 against Purdue (W, 25-10) and Minnesota (W, 58-7). His 143 yards rushing were a career high, besting his 141-yard effort against Michigan State in 1994.

BY THE NUMBERS ...

Memphis' 96 total yards of offense was the fewest by a Michigan opponent since Oct. 15, 1983, when Northwestern gained just 79 yards in a 35-0 Wolverine victory ... the Tigers' 12 punts (for 400 yards) marked the first time since at least 1979 a Michigan opponent punted 10 or more times. Illinois punted 11 times in 1980, a 45-14 Michigan home win ... Memphis failed to convert a third-down (0-for-15), a Michigan record since the stat began being kept in 1981. Minnesota was 0-for-13 in 1992 ... Memphis' seven first downs were the fewest since Oct. 7, 1989, when Wisconsin was held to the same number ... Michigan's four fumbles is the most since the Wolverines fumbled four times Nov. 4, 1992 against Illinois.

HAYES HAULING 'EM IN
With five catches for 98 yards, senior wide receiver Mercury Hayes moved up two more places on the Michigan career receiving yards list. Hayes has 1,564 career receiving yards, having passed Jim Mandich (1,508, 1967-69) and Vince Bean (1,514, 1981-84) to move into sole possession of eighth place on the list. His 58-yard reception in the second quarter was the longest Michigan play of the year and Hayes' career-best. Hayes has eight games of more than 75 yards receiving, which moves him into a two-way tie with Jim Smith (1973-76) for sixth place on the all-time list.

TWO-MINUTE TOUCHDOWN DRILL

Michigan's last seven touchdown drives have all been completed in less than two minutes each, including five that were less than one minute each. In all, only one Wolverine TD drive has taken more than two minutes (2:35 for the winning TD against Virginia), and all 10 of Michigan's TD drives have taken a total of 11:23.

HORN HOT

Senior nose tackle Jason Horn had three tackles for loss (minus-22 yards) against Memphis, including two sacks for 17 yards. He ranks in a tie for third on the career sack yardage list (138, tied with Mike Evans, 1988-91), tied for fourth on the career sacks list (17) and sixth on the career tackles for loss yardage list (175).

TOOMER TRYING FOR THIRD

Michigan wide receiver Amani Toomer came into the game needing 36 yards to become the fourth player in Wolverine history to gain 2,000 career receiving yards. Toomer left the game in the second quarter with a shoulder injury, but amassed 18 yards in the game to move past Derrick Alexander (1,977 yards, 1989-93) into fourth place on the all-time receiving yards list. Toomer, with 1,982 career yards, needs 164 yards to tie Desmond Howard (2,146, 1989-91) for third place.

124 AND COUNTING
The crowd of 100,862 extended Michigan's streak of consecutive 100,000-plus crowds to 124 games. It was the third-smallest crowd since the streak began on Nov. 8,1975, and the smallest since Sept. 13, 1980, when 100,824 saw Michigan beat Northwestern, 17-10.

Senior wide receiver Todd Richards saw his first action of the season, catching three passes for 21 yards. He became the 12th receiver (sophomore Anthony Williams also caught his first pass of the year) to catch a pass from Scott Dreisbach this season ... with a pair of first-half touchdowns, Michigan improved its scoring advantage in the first half of the games this season to 24-7 ... Michigan's failed fourth-down attempt in the second quarter was its first non-successful effort in four tries this season.

POST-GAME QUOTES

Michigan vs. Memphis Sept. 9, 1995

FROM THE MICHIGAN PRESS ROOM

Head Coach Lloyd Carr:

(In general) "First I want to give Memphis a lot of credit. They gave our offense all they wanted...the best thing Memphis did was cause turnovers.

We wanted to win with improvement but we didn't do that with four turnovers. The great thing, however, was the defense rose to play with great emotion wherever they had to go in."

(On the play of the defense) "We thought after spring/fall that we'd have a strong defense. We thought Will Carr had a chance to be dominant and a lot of the linebackers have come on strong including (Rob) Swett and (Clint) Copenhaver. These kids have played well and so have (Sam) Sword, (Mike) Elston, and (David) Bowens."

(On being 3-0) "It just means we haven't lost...I told the kids little things add up-fumbles, jumping offsides--I told them this morning they didn't have the intensity they had the last two weeks. Maybe we were mentally distracted."

(On Amani Toomer) "He got injured in the first quarter, so we held him out of the second quarter to check him at halftime, and then decided to hold him out the rest of the game."

(On why Biakabutuka was on the sidelines in the fourth quarter) "It was intentional to play as many players as possible. We have to establish some other running backs."

(On the play of Ed Davis) "He's Mr. Dependability. He's a guy that we know when he gets the football, he will give everything he has. He ran hard, and made some good cuts."

(On the defensive line) "Players that are really playing great and with great intensity are (Jason) Horn and (Trent) Zenkewicz. They've been around, they know what they are doing. They are smart players, they know how to execute what they have been trained to do. They give offensive lines problems."

FROM THE MEMPHIS PRESS ROOM

Head Coach Rip Scherer:

(On Michigan's offense) "I thought our defense did a heck of a job, that's a heck of an offense. They demolished a team that was ranked a lot higher than us and were supposed to be a factor in the Big Ten last week. Our guys just fought to make plays."

(On the match-up) "Offensively we were never able to get going. They are obviously a program that is ahead of where we are. They should be. They've got a lot better people than we do in some areas and we had some mismatches that we just couldn't compensate for."

(On the Memphis offense) "It was a frustrating day offensively. It's tough to call plays when they are in your backfield all day."

(On missed opportunities) "We had chances to win, the defense got us the ball down inside a number of times either we turned it over or squandered those opportunities and got sacked."

(On the Memphis option) "We could never establish the option because we could never get the ball to the proper option key or pitch key a lot of the time and that was due to their defense and their penetration."
