STREAK EXTENDS TO 133 GAMES

Michigan's streak of crowds over 100,000 fans extended to 133 games with today's announced crowd of 106,088. The streak began on Nov. 9, 1975 versus Purdue and has stretched for 21 years. Indiana was Michigan's last opponent to play against a crowd less than 100,000 fans at Michigan Stadium (93,857 saw Michigan defeat the Hoosiers, 55-7, on Oct. 25, 1975).

CENTENNIAL HOMECOMING GAME

Today's contest between Michigan and Indiana marked the 100th homecoming game played by the Wolverines. Michigan is now 74-24-2 (.750) in homecoming matchups, and has won 26 of their last 29.

WOODSON HAS CAREER BEST OFFENSIVE PERFORMANCE

Sophomore cornerback/wide receiver **Charles Woodson (Fremont, OH)** had a career best offensive day with four receptions for 55 yards and a 48-yard reverse for a touchdown. All three receptions came on Michigan scoring drives, with his 28-yard reception and 48-yard scamper setting career longs. For the afternoon, Woodson gained 103 yards of total offensive on the day, and was credited with two tackles defensively (one for a loss of four yards).

HAMILTON MOVES INTO FIFTH PLACE IN SCORING

Senior placekicker **Remy Hamilton (Boca Raton, FL)** moved into fifth place on Michigan's all-time scoring with nine points on the day (two field goals and three extra points). His 242 career points moved him ahead of Heisman trophy winner **Tom Harmon (237 points, 1938-40)** and is within two points of wide receiver **Anthony Carter (244, 1979-82)**. Hamilton's 28-yard and 39-yard field goals moved him within two of the all-time career field goal record (53) set by **Mike Gillete (1985-88)**. Hamilton ranks third in career kick scoring.

ANES SCORES FIRST CAREER TD

True freshman **John Anes (Kentwood, MI)** scored the first touchdown of his Michigan career in the first quarter on a one-yard run. Anes, into the game because of an injury to starter Chris Floyd, kept the Wolverine drive alive with a one-yard run on fourth down. He carried the ball three times on the drive for four yards (two carries each for a first down and one for a yard and a touchdown).

IU SCORES FIRST POINTS AGAINST U-M IN FIRST QUARTER

Eric Allen's 42-yard interception return for a touchdown was the first points scored against the Wolverines in the first quarter this year. The Michigan defense has not allowed an opponent any offensive points all season during the first quarter.

INDIANA SCORES MOST POINTS AGAINST MICHIGAN IN 1996

The 20 points scored by Indiana today was the most scored by an opponent versus Michigan all year. In addition, the Hoosiers 17 first half points were the most scored by an opponent in the opening half all season, and the total tied Northwestern for the most points scored against the Wolverines in a half.

STREETS PLAYS ALL-AROUND GAME

Sophomore **Tai Streets (Matteson, IL)** notched 63 yards receiving on the day with two receptions. In addition to his receptions, Streets caused and recovered a second quarter fumble after Indiana's Eric Allen picked up a Wolverine fumble.

IRONS MOVES INTO FIFTH

Senior co-captain **Jarrett Irons (The Woodlands, TX)**, a semifinalist for the Butkus Award, led the Wolverines with 12 tackles (10 solo, two assist) against Indiana. With his 12 tackles, Irons has career tackles total to 388 (264 solo, 124 assists) vaulting from seventh to fifth. In the Indiana game, he moved of **Calvin O'Neal (378, 1974-76)** and **Andy Cannavino (385, 1977-80)**.

BALANCED PASSING ATTACK

While sophomore Tai Streets with 63 yards on his two catches, the rest of the receiving corp was balanced. Woodson tallied four receptions for 55-yards, **Russell Shaw (Los Angeles, CA)** was four for 42, and tight end **Jerame Tuman (Liberal, KS)** was four for 41. Tuman's third quarter touchdown reception was this third "game-winner."

MICHIGAN VS. INDIANA
OCTOBER 19, 1996

HEAD COACH LLOYD CARR:

(On the game in general...) "We didn't play well at all, particularly offensively. Certainly we have to play better than that. We've got some improvements to make. If we don't we'll have a long road to go."

(On the play of Charles Woodson...) "Well he's a great athlete and he was the difference in that game today. He made a couple of plays when we were down 17-7 he made two big plays and of course got us the big touchdown in the second half that got us back in the game. I thought more than anything else that we had to throw the ball more today because of the nature of Indiana's defense and we had people open, but Scott (Dreisbach) overthrew a lot of people today and it was not his better performance, but he'll do better."

(On the competition...) "My hat is off to Indiana and their coaching staff, they did a tremendous job getting a group of kids who have lost a lot of games. They came in here and played hard and played extremely well. They play defense and run the football and that's what they did today."

(On the passing game...) "I knew we were going to have trouble moving the ball on the ground if we couldn't throw. We have to be able to throw with more consistency than we did today."

(On the offense in general...) "I think the main thing is that when teams play defense when they put that many people on the line they force you to throw. The defenses can force you to throw and if you can't throw you are out of luck. I don't like to play that kind of football from the standpoint that I think you have to be able to run. I am just not happy with our running game today, although we did improve in the second half."

CORNERBACK CHARLES WOODSON:

(On the 48-yard reverse play...) "Well it kind of felt as though I kind of bought myself some time and waited for things to open up. I got great blocking downfield and I just took it for the distance."

(On the adjustments made at halftime...) "Yeah we came out in the second half fired up, we just tried to put that first half in the back of our minds and play Michigan football and we did that."

(On playing both sides of the ball...) "Yeah I got pretty tired in the first half but you've got to keep playing and try to get a victory."

HEAD COACH BILL MALLORY:

(On the loss...) "Naturally it's a disappointing loss. They say winning and losing a lot of times is a matter of inches. When you look at it, maybe something here or something there (would have made the difference). We came in here with the feeling that we could win. We played determined throughout the game, right up until the last seconds."

(On Rodgers' performance...) "I thought (Jay) Rodgers played well in his first opportunity to start. I thought he came in and really did a job other than that fumble. I don't know what happened, he may have come out of there a little quick on the one. Then we got it stopped. That was one thing that can't happen."

(On IU's situation...) "It was a hard-fought game. We came up on the short end of the stick. We are in a situation where we've just got to stay determined. I told them that (after the game). We've just got to stay in there and keep swinging. We are going to go on from here and get better."

(On Alex Smith...) "For the most part he's been playing well for us. He is going to give you 110 percent. He was hurt this week coming in. He had turf toe and we really had to back him off in practice this week. He came to play today. He has a lot of heart."

(On Eric Allen...) "I thought Eric (played well). I wish he could have held on to that one (fumble recovery). He let it get away. We could have maybe come up and made something of that. We're talking inches...as far as his play his play is concerned, I was really pleased with Eric."

(On starting Rodgers...) "I gave it a lot of thought and slept on it last night. I got up and felt that's the way I wanted to go. I just felt he gives us some quickness that we need in our offense and allows us to do some things that we want to do offensively just simply because of his athletic ability and particularly his quickness. I thought that really helped because they are a good, quick defense. They really come after you. They are more of a pressure defense."

(On Indiana's offensive line...) "I thought our line has been coming (around). They've proven themselves. They are good, strong bulk up front. I thought for the most part we did a pretty good job and controlled the ball."

(On the final fourth down attempt...) "That was too bad at the end when we came out on the option and didn't get that made on that fourth-and-one. I felt good. I felt we had a good shot. We were talking and I was going to go for the win. I was going for two today. It's what I was going to do. We needed that rather than going into an overtime. Had I had that opportunity, I know what my decision was going to be."
