## Michigan vs. Baylor Game Notes

100,000 ... AGAIN
For the 137th consecutive game Michigan Stadium has hosted over 100,000 fans. The 106,041 fans who attended the Baylor game marks the 30th largest crowd in Michigan Stadium history.

## CARR STILL PERFECT IN SEPTEMBER

Michigan's $38-3$ victory over Baylor improved Coach Loyd Carr's record to $9-0$ in September games. Carr's teams are $6-0$ at home in the month. In the string, U-M is outscoring opponents 266-95 in September.

## FRESHMEN CARRYING THE LOAD

Michigan featured four freshmen running backs against Baylor. Tailback Anthony Thomas (Winnfield, LA) rushed for 122 yards on 21 carries, including his first touchdown, a two yard run in the third quarter. Thomas became the first freshman running hack since Tyrone Wheatley in 1991 to rush for over 100 yards. Tailbac:: Patrick McCall (Carson, CA) made his debut with four rushes for 12 yards and three receptions for 14 yards. Fullback Demetrius Smith (Calumet Park, II) made his first career start, while fullback Ray Jackson (Indianapolis, IN) saw extensive action in his first carecr game. Both Smith and Thomas saw action in last week's win over Colorado.

## FIRST QUARTER STREAK ALIVE ... BEAR-LY

Michigan's first quarter defensive streak, was extended to 27 consecutive regular season games without allowing a touchdown. Following a fumble recovery, it appeared as if the Bears had broken the streak, but a holding penalty waved off the touchdown run and the defense forced Baylor to settle for a field goal instead.

## AIRING IT OUT

Senior quarterback Brian Griese (Miami, FL) moved his way into the top ten in two categories. His first quarter completion to Russell Shaw was the 186th of Griese's career, tying him with Dick Vidmer (1965-67) for tenth all-time. Griese further moved up the career charts in the second quarter when he hooked up with Chris Howard on an 11-yard pass, moving the signal caller into the top ten in carecr passing yards. On his 19th pass of the game, in the third quarter, Griese tied John Wangler (1976-80) for tenth on the career passes attempted list. Griesc wound up with 13 completions on 22 attempts for 169 yards for the day, giving him 196 completions, 349 attempts, and 2,517 yards in his carcer.

## WOODSON DOES IT ALL

All-American Charles Woodson (Freemont, OH) hauled in his second career touchdown pass (third touchdown of his career) on a ten-yard catch and run from Brian Griese at 5:39 of the first quarter. He had another touchdown reception ( 29 yards) waved off in the third quarter due to an illegal formation. Woodson ended the game with two receptions for 45 yards, one touchdown, five unassisted tackles, three takcles for a loss ( -11 yards) and four punt returns for 21 yards. He played a total of 57 plays - 46 on defense, six on special teams and five on offense.

## HOWARD TOPS 1,000

Senior tailback Chris Howard (River Ridge, LA) became the 46th Wolverine to surpass the 1,000 yard mark for his career. Howard ended the game with 112 yards off of 19 carries, his sixth career 100 -yard day. Howard and freshman Anthony Thomas became the 29 th duo to both run for 100 yards in one game, and the first since Tyrone Wheatley and Tshimanga Biakabutuka ran for 148 and 100 yards respectively, at Purdue in 1994. He now has 1,090 yards for his career, 42 nd highest in school history. Fellow tailback, Clarence Williams (Detroit, MI) joined the 1,000 -yard club in last season's win at Ohio State and finished the game with 1,183 for his career.

## ATTEBERRY'S BLAST

Baylor punter Kyle Atteberry (Kingwood, TX) blasted a career-long 68 -yard punt in the second quarter, pinning Michigan down to the eight-yard line. The last time an opponent cranked a punt of more than 60 yards was Hayden Stockton ( 60 yards) of Alabama in last season's Outback Bowl. Attebery also boomed a 58 -yard punt in the fourth quarer, en route to a 42.9 -yard average.

## HITCHHIKER SEES ACTION

Baylor hitchhiker LeTroy Hamilton (Sacramento, CA) saw his first action against Michigan and caused a three-yard loss on his second play.
MISCELLANEOUS MICHIGAN NOTES
Jay Feeley's (Odessa, FL) 51 -yard field goal was his career long and is tied for the fifth longest in U-M history … DeWayne Patmon (San Diego, CA) collected his first career interception ... walk-on Tate Schanski (Perry, MI) recorded his first career carry and first career touchdown ... quarterback Jason Kapsner (Eden Prairie, MN) made his career debut.

## FROM THE MICHIGAN LOCKER ROOM:

## HEAD COACH LLOYD CARR

(On the game in general ...) "Our goal was to improve, and after a slow start we adjusted to the option ... we ran extremely well, and we got to play a lot of players. That is good for morale."
"Baylor has an undersized defense. They played hard."
(On the play of the offensive line ...) "Zach Adami, who is back (at center), has a lot of experience. All of the kids (on the offensive line) are going to be good. It was also good to get Paul Tannous (coming off shoulder surgery) and David Brandt in for snaps."
(On holding Baylor to a field goal after turning the ball over in Michigan territory ...) "Charles Woodson made a touchdown saving play, zid our defense kept them out of the endzone. We call it sudden change when the offense turns (the ball) over, and our goal is to come out with a field goal and we did. It is a morale booster for us."
(On the Michigan defense ...) "They displayed quickness and intensity that great defenses do, but we will be tested. You judge defenses on a season. We have a long road to go. You have to stay focused."
(On the punting of Jason Vinson, specifically after the high snap ...) "He made an absolutely tremendous play turning a negative play into better field position for us."
(On the biggest improvement between games one and two ...) "We ran with the ball much more effectively. I was happy to see Anthony Thomas run the ball. You saw what he is capable of doing.'
(On the 92 -yard, 16 play drive that took 7:13 off the clock ...) "I thought it was a great call by (offensive coordinator Mike) Debord. We didn't want to punt with our kicker up against the endzone. It was a critical play that got us the first down, then we executed well, and our backs ran hard. We (the offensive line)were a lot better up front."

## SENIOR RUNNING BACK CHRIS HOWARD

(On using three backs in the game ...) "Any running back wants to get in and play. With all three of us (Howard, Clarence Williams, or Anthony Thomas) out there, it gives us each a chance to get warmed up and really get a feel for what is going on out on the field."
"Any time you have three backs with big games, you can't really key on any of us."

## JUNIOR RUNNING BACK CLARENCE WILLIAMS

(On the power running game...) "It was a total team effort. Hopefully today will spark our running game for the season."
(On the two 92-yard time-consuming drives ...) "The more we are on the field, the more our confidence builds and that allows us to go all the way."

## POST-GAME OUOTES .. BAYLOR

## Coach Dave Roberts

(On Michigan)
"They are a great football team. They really beat us up on the line of scrimmage. You have to give them credit for playing this game this well between Colorado and Notre Dame. That's what good football teams do."
(On Baylor's offensive performance)
"Offensively we couldn't run the ball at all. We had that option early. I thought we caught them by surprise. After that I didn't think we gained more than a few yards on any play. They knocked us around pretty good."

## (On Charles Woodson)

"Gosh. He's awesome. I don't know if you can prepare to handle him. We tried. Often, he looks like he's running slowly, but with his gait he's probably running a 4.3... He may be the best football player in the country. He may be a first round draft choice."
(General statement on Baylor's performance)
"I was proud of our defense. I though they made tremendous improvements. Offensively, we didn't block the line of scrimmage and didn't do a good job on their comers. If we want to be any kind of football team we need to make some plays."
(On Baylor's mental frame)
"I'm not concerned about that. I thought our guys played hard. As long as we play hard we'll make improvements. That's what we need to do to see how far we need to go. We need to play top twenty and top five teams. We got a pretty good idea of that today."
(On controlling Michigan's athleticism)
"I thought we did a nice job. We missed some tackles but when they are throwing to a 4.3 guy and our guy is 4.9 what can you tell them? We just told them to keep playing. We're going to find some missed tackles (on the film) but I thought we did a nice job."
(On comparing Michigan to Miami)
"There is no comparison. They're just as strong, just as fast and they have just as many good players. I don't know of any weaknesses that Michigan has."
(On predicting Michigan and Notre Dame)
'I don't know (what will happen). It should be a great game. It's a great rivalry. Notre Dame has got some good players. They've got a new coaching staff and it's going to take some time."

## JEROD DOUGLAS, SENIOR RUNNING BACK

(On Michigan)
"We knew this was going to be a tougit task. They played like the top five or ten team I think they are."
(On failing to score a touchdown on Baylor's early drive)
"Of course you are going to lose some confidence when you have a drive like that and you can't score (a touchdown). Our defense had made a big play but we didn't take advantage of it and we had to kick a field goal."
