SO FAR	BEGINNING WITH THIS LESSON
-part of speech: coordinating conjunction	-part of speech: subordinating conjunction
-sentences can have more than one clause. So far, clauses are on an equal level, i.e., two main clauses.	-a sentence may have clauses which are not on an equal level, i.e., main and dependent/subordinate
-several types of adverbial modifiers (syntactic equivalents)	-a new type: a dependent clause
-clauses have kernels and possibly connectors and modifiers	-dependent clauses have kernels and possibly connectors and modifiers
-expectations	-a dependent clause raises the expectation of a main clause
