SO FAR	BEGINNING WITH THIS LESSON
-parts of speech: noun, verb, infinitive, coordinating conjunction, pronoun (interrogative)	-parts of speech: adverb and preposition
-two of the big 3 categories used in describing components of a sentence: kernel items and connectors	-the third of the big 3: modifiers. (From now on each word in the sentence can be classified as a kernel item, connectors, and/or modifier.)
-two cases of the Latin noun: nominative and accusative	-another case of the Latin noun: the ablative
-semantic features of words	-additional semantic features and categories of vocabulary items
-expectations raised by kernel items and connectors	-a modifier raises the expectation of a head
-metaphrasing guidelines	-additional metaphrasing guidelines
