articles you've made in the past--either for  
Christmas or otherwise. So don't be shy-- bring  
any little clever thing you've made or that have  
been given to you, so that we can all benefit from  
those ideas!  
At the meeting, we will be making Christmas  
candleholders from medium-size ball tree ornaments  
(with removable hooks).  
The first project calls for making single candle-  
holders. You may make only one or a group.  
Materials: Medium-size ball ornaments (all the  
same or contrasting colors); plastic or brass  
curtain rings; decorative metallic ribbon, rick-  
rack, braid, or gold lace; small candle (taper)  
for each ball; rice or sand; Elmer's glue.  
The second project is a grouping of the above  
candleholders on cardboard-tube stands for a  
buffet, window, or table. (Our grouping consisted  
of eleven candles and holders.)  
Materials: Same as above, except for curtain  
rings, plus two or three cardboard paper towel  
tubes; colored tissue paper to harmonize with  
the balls and candles; greenery to weave between  
candles; cellophane tape; sharp knife; long narrow  
piece of cardboard for the base (this may be in  
sections).
