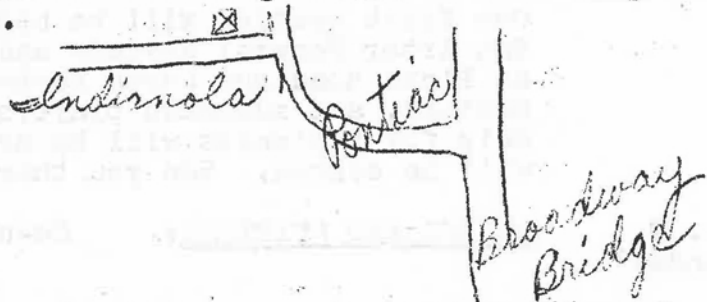

CHARM AND HOME

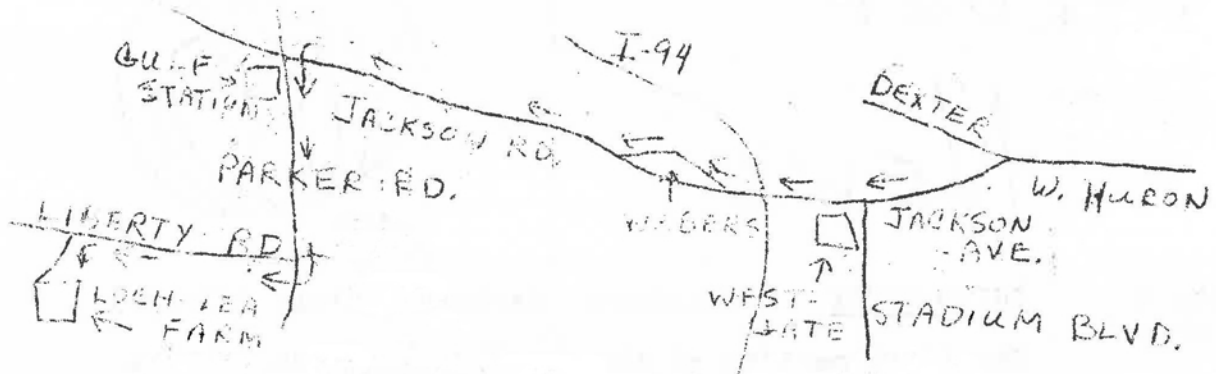
