## Investigating Things That Can Sink and Float

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Today I made three Cartesian Diver Systems (CDS). They are shown in Figure 1. This will help me study why things float and sink. Figure 1. Different Cartesian Diver Systems.




Table 1. Characteristics of different divers.

| DIVER                           | CDS 1         | CDS 2          | CDS 3          |
|---------------------------------|---------------|----------------|----------------|
| MATERIAL                        | Glass Tube    | Glass Vial     | Plastic Vial   |
| VOLUME<br>(of the hollow diver) | 8 milliliters | 11 milliliters | 14 milliliters |
| MASS<br>(of diver when empty)   | 5 grams       | 3 grams        | 1 gram         |
