Sc.M., Sc.D., Director of UM Global Health Program

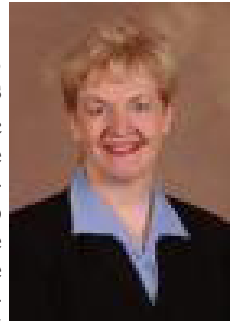
