## Programming Awards

Awards will be presented the following Programming Award Categories. **All chapters are encouraged to submit award applications for each category.**

- Chapter Program of the Year
- Community Service Award
- Scholastic Programming Award
- Campus Impact Award

**There is no minimum or maximum number of Programming Awards for which a chapter can or must apply.**

## Individual Achievement Awards

Individual outstanding achievement will be recognized in one of the following categories.

- Outstanding Male Prophyte of the Year
- Outstanding Female Prophyte of the Year
- Outstanding Male Neophyte of the Year
- Outstanding Female Neophyte of the Year
- Divine Nine Award (outstanding commitment to NPHC and the Greek Community)
- Faculty/GSI Achievement Award

# Programming Awards

For each category your chapter chooses to apply, you will need:

- Cover sheet complete with
    - Chapter Name
    - Award Name
    - Contact Information
  - Attach a sheet with answers to the questions listed for the category.
  - Attach any additional items that may factor into the judging of the awards.
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## Campus Impact Award

1. List your members' involvement in Greek-Related Organizations including HTF, GARP, Greek Week, GPO, etc. (names and positions held).
2. Discuss the chapter's participation in Office of Greek Life/NPHC sponsored events.
3. List your members' involvement in organizations at the University of Michigan. Include a list of names and organizations of involved members including any positions held
4. The chapter attendance at council meetings during the evaluation period will be considered.

## Chapter Program of the Year

1. Discuss your chapter's goals and objectives regarding educating your members and the University Community.
2. Please detail the ONE event that you are choosing to recognize here. The following information is recommended.
  - Event Title
  - Date of Event
  - Details of event including speaker
    - a. Audience Served
    - b. Rationale and Outcomes
    - c. Collaboration?
    - d. Goals of Event
    - e. Attendance
    - f. Cost
    - g. Benefits of Event to Campus
  - Brief evaluation of event and its outcomes

## Community Service Award

1. Complete Event Sheets on activities held with Community groups (i.e.: City of Ann Arbor, Neighbors, campus community, other chapters) including the attendance and hours of members of your chapter.
2. Discuss the ways in which your chapter communicates/works/relates to Community.
3. Discuss ways your chapter is trying to improve relations with Community.
4. What programs has your organization implemented to assist the campus community and your community at large.

## Scholastic Programming Award

1. Complete Event Sheets for activities held that center around scholastic endeavors for your chapter. These can include chapter programs designed for your members (tutoring, study skills), for youth (tutoring, peer mentoring), or for the campus at large. These programs should have been academic in nature.
2. Discuss the ways in which your chapter promotes scholastic achievement and excellence through its programming and membership development.

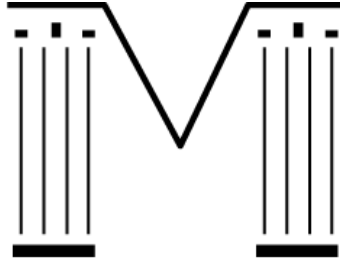
