## Friendly Reminders

### Check-In Deadlines

- ◆ All golfers must register in the golf shop **at least 20 minutes** prior to their starting time and present their season-pass or affiliate identification.
- ◆ Failure to meet with the starter **at least 15 minutes** before the scheduled tee time may result in the loss of the reserved time to a waiting group.
- ◆ Golfers need to arrive at the tee, ready to play, and present their registration receipt **at least five minutes** before the tee time.

### Weekend Tee Time Lottery

- ◆ Season-pass holders need to submit lottery request cards by Sunday night for the following weekend.
- ◆ Only one non-season pass holder is permitted per foursome before 11 a.m.
- ◆ Lottery results are published on the web page ([www.umich.edu/~radrick](http://www.umich.edu/~radrick)) on Monday.

### Frost Delays

Below freezing temperatures are still a possibility. When there is a frost delay, please be patient and remember to **stay off all grass areas**.

## Pace-of-Play Clocks

There are three clocks on the golf course. The first is posted on the bridge between the fifth hole and the sixth tee. The time has been set back by 1 hour and 9 minutes. It reflects your pace of play. Upon leaving the fifth green, the clock should read no later than the time you teed off on the first hole (if you are keeping pace!) A second is located at the food cart for the turn time. It has been set back 2 hours as you should be making the turn no later than 2 hours after you teed off on the first hole. A third clock is on the water station at the

### Senior Golf Cart Policy

To be eligible for the senior cart discount, the golfer must be over the age of 65 and present their drivers license to the golf shop attendant.

### Travel Between Nines

Please **do not walk across the first tee** when going between the ninth and tenth hole.

Follow the path around the rear of the first tee.

### Pace of Play

The maximum playing time allowed is four and one-quarter hours, making the turn from the front to the back nine within two hours.

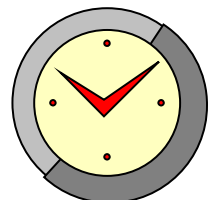
### Driving Range Schedule

### Video analysis software from V1 Sports

*May 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> 2009*

*1pm – 3pm at the Practice Range*

- ◆ Captures and plays your swing to see in real time
- ◆ V1 permits the player to view their swing at different speeds
- ◆ Compare your swing to others swing
- ◆ Draw lines on the screen over your video

### Science & Motion Puttlab -

*May 30<sup>th</sup> 2009*

*1pm-3pm at the Practice Putting Green*

The SAM Puttlab feedback will help the player understand their putt stroke so you can make more putts.

Feedback includes:

- ◆ Consistence of aim at address
- ◆ Putter face angle at impact
- ◆ How the putter moves throughout the stroke
- ◆ Path of the putter and much more

*These technologies have no specific models or philosophies attached to them. They just show the player how you move. **These events are complementary to all but please register in advance through the golf shop.** This is a great time to see what the excitement is all about and how technology can get you to your goals faster.*

May is also 10 minute **FREE** lesson month. This a national program through the PGA of America. Mark will have open times that you can just drop in for a Swing Tip or you can schedule a time.

### Get Golf Ready 101

## Bunker Etiquette

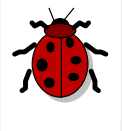
**Never walk up the bunker faces! Always exit out the low side and walk around the bunker.**
