

Linas A. Bieliauskas (Elected by the Ohio University). Dr. Bieliauskas received his B.S. degree from Xavier University (Ohio) and M.S and Ph.D. degrees from Ohio University. He joined the faculty at UM in 1989 and was promoted to professor in 2013. He served as training director of the Neuropsychology Section of the Psychiatry Department for 30 years (1990-2020). He is the author of two books and numerous book chapters and peer-reviewed articles related to cognitive and affective changes due to normal and abnormal aging.

Kent B. Joscelyn (Elected by the Indiana University Chapter). Kent Joscelyn received his B.S. degree from Union College in 1957 and his Juris Doctor degree from Albany Law School of Union University in 1960. He worked as an Associate Professor in the Department of Forensic Studies and School of Public and Environmental Affairs at Indiana University from 1967-1975. His research interests focus on traffic safety and he was adjunct Professor of Epidemiology in the University of Michigan School of Public Health in 1996.

Friedrich K. Port (Elected by the Mayo Foundation Chapter). Dr. Port received his M.D. degree from the University of Erlangen-Nurnberg (West Germany) in 1964 and a M.S. degree from the University of Minnesota in 1975. He is currently Emeritus Professor in Epidemiology and Internal Medicine at the University of Michigan. His research focus in in Dialysis Outcomes and Practice Patterns Study (DOPPS), which helps shape practice and policy for better health across the world.

Steven J. Wright (Elected by the Washington State Chapter). Dr. Wright received his B.S and M.S. degrees at Washington State University in 1971 and 1973, respectively, and his Ph.D. degree at California Institute of Technology in 1977. He is currently Emeritus Professor in the Civil and Environmental Engineering Department at the University of Michigan. His research interests focus on the intersection of fluid dynamics and environmental engineering.

The Scientific Research Honor Society

Sigma Xi was founded in 1886 by a group of Cornell students and a faculty member who believed the time had come to establish an honor society for scientists and engineers. The purpose of the society was to reward excellence in scientific research as well as to encourage a sense of companionship and cooperation among scientists in all fields. The University of Michigan Chapter was established as the 16th Chapter of Sigma Xi in 1903 when thirty-five faculty and students were granted a charter to establish a Chapter at Michigan. The first President of the local Chapter was Professor J. Playfair McMurrich.

Since 1886, *Sigma Xi* has grown to include more than 800 Chapters throughout the world. The Society now has approximately 90,000 Members and Associate Members. Chapters are found wherever scientific research is undertaken in nations throughout the world, in universities, colleges, industrial research facilities and government laboratories.
